Highlights of Achievements











Mosque for the community (Jhang Project - Ehsaas Trust)

Sanjh Preet Organization has constructed two mosques with the support of Ehsaas Foundation in Purana Shehar Noorpur Manjhowala in Jampur, District Rajanpur, and Kho Bairanwala Mangan Bango, Shorkot, District Jhang.

Shelter homes for the shelterless

With the support of Ehsaas Trust, Sanjh Preet has constructed two shelter homes for the extremely poor shelterless women in District Jhang.

WASH project

Under the WASH thematic area, Sanjh Preet is providing muchneeded clean drinking water through installation of hand pumps at household and community levels in District Rajanpur with the support of Penny Appeal Pakistan and EHSAAS TRUST. Under this project, 115 hand pumps have been installed.

Food distribution

To address the challenge of malnutrition and food insecurity, Sanjh Preet has distributed 900 food ration packs among the poor and low income families who cannot purchase ration in current situation in Rajanpur & DG Khan districts with the generous support of Ehsaas Trust and Muslim Charity.







Strengthening of Learning and Protection of Children (SLPC)

Solidar Suisse is supporting Sanjh Preet in implementing the Strengthening of Learning and Protection of Children (SLPC) project in four slum areas of Islamabad: Golra, Bari Imam, Pir Wadhai, and Khanna Pull. With technical input of JICA, the project provides tailored education solutions and bridges learning gaps for children, especially girls, complementing existing non-formal education institutions besides protecting children from abuse and violence through linkages with govt and NGO support services.

- 17 formal and 5 non-formal schools are providing education to the vulnerable 3019 children of slum areas of Islamabad.
- 123 Teachers trained on teaching methodologies
- 19 Parents groups formed and positively engaged in school and child protection activities
- Capacity of 92 members of child protection committees enhanced through regular sessions on community-based child protections mechanism.
- 3,019 Children participated in plantation activity

From a Child Bride to a Student: Nisha's Journey

Nisha was only 12 years old when she got married. It was an arranged marriage, and she had no say in the matter. Her life became one of domestic duties and child-rearing. At the tender age of just 14, she became a mother. Her days were filled with feeding, changing, and caring for her little one.

But deep down, Nisha always yearned for something more. She missed her studies and the friends she had made at school. She longed for the freedom to learn and explore the world beyond the four walls of her home. And so, when she heard about the Rimsha Community School, she knew she had to give it a try.

The school is being run by Sanjh Preet Organization under the Strengthening of Learning and Protection of Children Programme. It was a unique initiative that aimed to bring quality education to the doorstep of marginalized children like Nisha. The school was located just a few blocks away from her house, and the teachers were warm and welcoming.



Nisha was nervous at first, but as she sat in her classroom and listened to her teacher, her fears melted away. She was surrounded by children her own age, all eager to learn, and she felt a sense of belonging that she had never experienced before. The curriculum was challenging, but Nisha was determined to catch up on all the years of schooling she had missed.

Today, Nisha is a bright and curious 15-year-old, full of hope and ambition for the future. She knows that her journey is far from over, but with the help of the Rimsha Community School and the Strengthening of Learning and Protection of Children Programme, she is determined to reach her full potential and make a better life for herself and her family.

JICA-ALP Middle Tech Project- Nankana Sahib



The Project is being implemented in collaboration of Japan international cooperation Agency (JICA) with the purpose; to provide second chance of education to the girls who have left school after completing primary education due to any reason. Under the project, Allama Iqbal open University (AIOU) registered 74 students (13 boys and 61 girls) with its distance learning programme, and would also certify them after conducting examination.

Learners learn through self-learning kit and they meet their teacher's minimum three times a week (face to face) to get further support, mentoring and assessment. Learning tablets have also been provided to a group of 5-6 learners as well as each teacher for learning and assessment.
