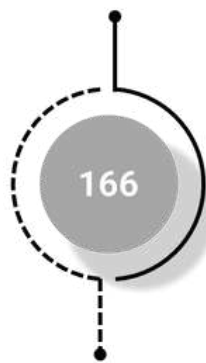

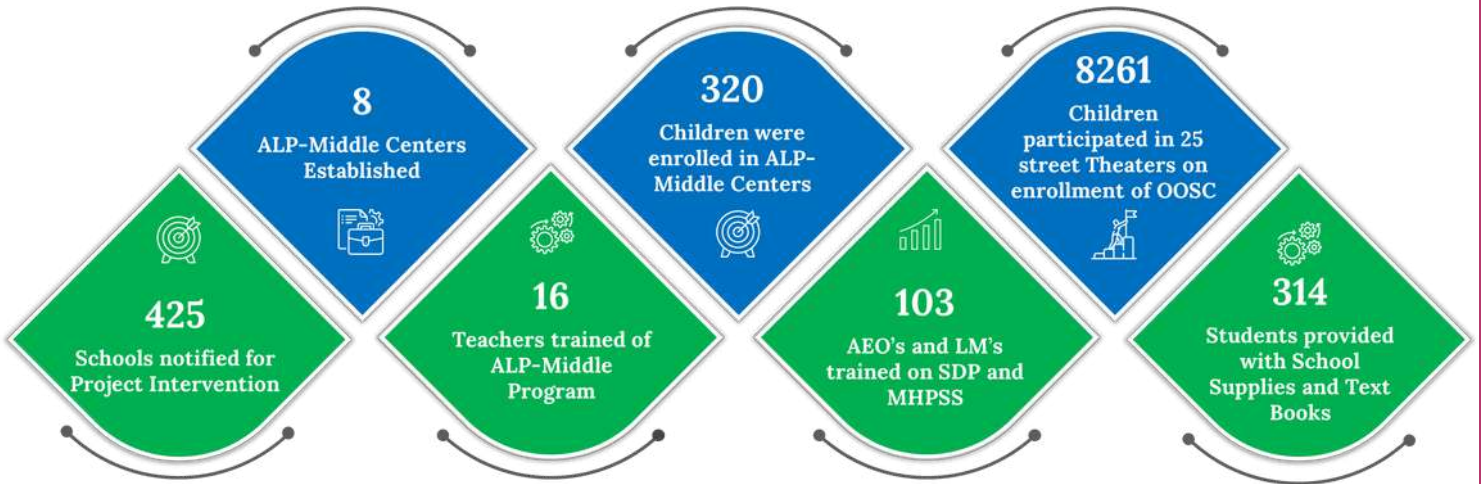


WASH PROJECTS

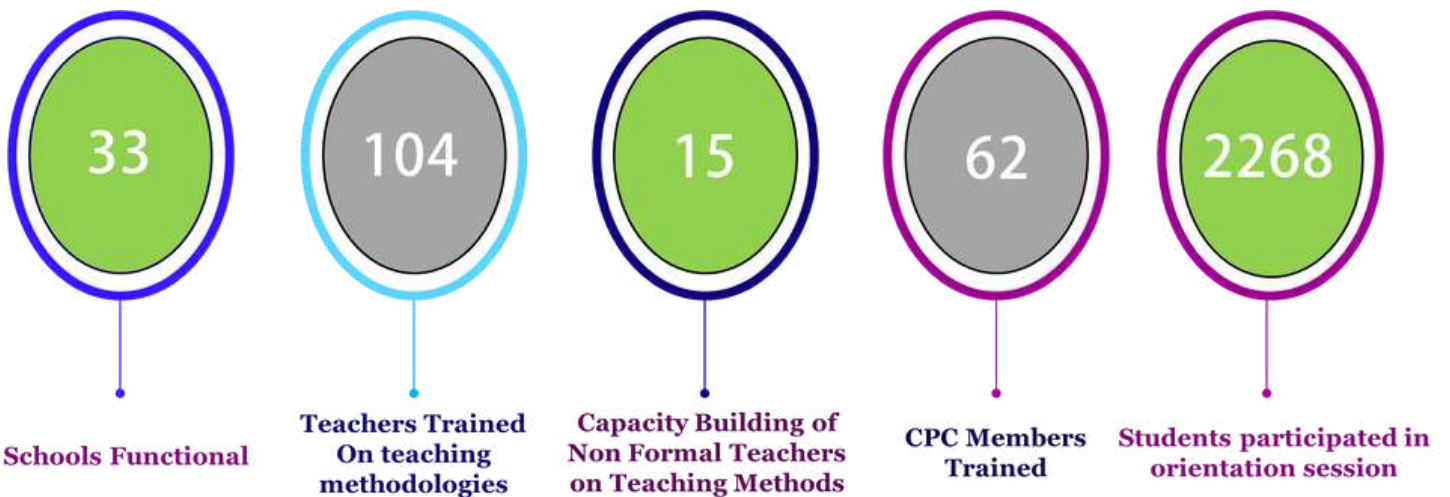

These centers have become hubs of excellence in education and skills development, positively impacting the lives of countless individuals. Through innovative teaching methods, dedicated instructors, and state-of-the-art facilities, our ALP centers are empowering students to reach their full potential. ALP graduates are making a tangible difference in their communities and beyond. We are immensely proud of their accomplishments and the role JICA plays in fostering their growth. As we move forward, we remain committed to expanding the reach of the ALP centers, ensuring that even more individuals can access quality education and training opportunities. Together, we are building a brighter future. Currently there are two centers running by the organization, in which total of 65 students are studying package E.

ALP MIDDLE PROGRAM IS TRANSFORMING LIVES

The acute scarcity of schools in Pakistan as well as in the target districts, restricts transition of learners to vertical learning cycles. In such situation where supply side limitations are impacting the OOSC crises especially at elementary or secondary levels, ALP-Elementary Program can offer a viable learning solution to OOSC. Seeing the dire need of out of school children of the target flood affected districts of DG Khan and Rajanpur, Sanjh Preet in partnership with UNICEF and SED South Punjab is piloting ALP-Middle Program to provide the second chance of education to the dropped-out girls at their doorstep level. This program is going on very successfully as more than expected girls are getting enrolled and several case studies can reflect how this program is relevant and accessible to hundreds of girls.



One of the case studies is of Muqadas and her mother Salma Qadeer as both of them enrolled in the ALP center of DG Khan. Muqadas Zahra, 4th class passed, twelve years old is the daughter of Salma Qadeer, a 35-year-old, primary passed women, both are living in the village Imranabad, UC Mamoori of District Dera Ghazi Khan. Muqadas restarted her education and dreamed to become doctor in future while her mother Salma Qadeer left her education 25 years ago prior to the marriage due to the unavailability elementary school in the nearby area and now she wanted to continue her study to care her daughter and other family members after getting the elementary education from this ALP center.

The story of Salma and Muqadas exemplifies the transformative power of education provided by the collaborative efforts of UNICEF and Sanjh Preet Organization through their shared journey of learning at ALP center, they are not only acquiring literacy skills but also challenged social norms and inspire their community.
