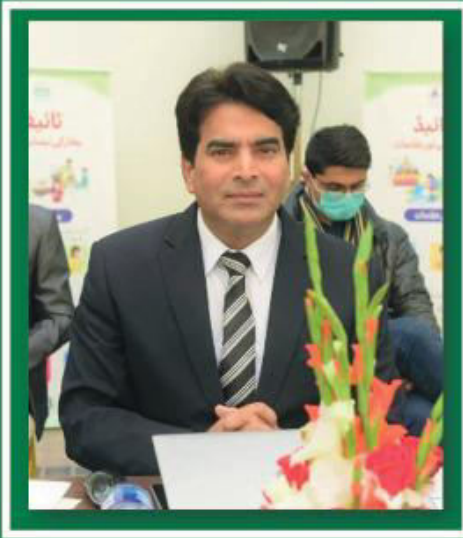


## Aims, Objectives and Goals

# KEY AREAS OF OPERATION

# EDUCATION

Sanjh Preet recognizes the importance of improving education in the communities it serves. The organization has implemented several interventions aimed at supporting grassroots level communities, with a focus on providing the resources they need to succeed in the classroom.

One of the key ways that Sanjh Preet has been working to improve the enrollment and retention of out-of-school children is by designing and implementing need-based programs, such as non-formal schools for marginalized girls in rural areas. These interventions have brought back thousands of out-of-school children and helped them continue their education to higher grades.

Sanjh Preet has played a pivotal role in resuming the education of calamity-affected children during emergencies. The organization's key interventions include the provision of missing facilities, teaching and learning materials, teacher training, and need-based supplies such as books, stationary, uniforms, and clothes. Community awareness on the importance of education, gender-based violence, and protection against sexual exploitation and abuse are also crucial interventions during emergencies. Collaboration with the UNICEF

Sanjh Preet Organization collaborated with UNICEF to launch the "Education Response & Restoration of Flood-Affected Schools" project in Dera Ghazi Khan and Rajanpur districts in November 2022. This initiative aimed to provide emergency response activities to the 153 most flood-affected schools, as identified by the CEO-District Education Authority of both districts.

During the project period, Sanjh Preet set up 118 winterized and high-performance tents in government schools and non-formal literacy centres to ensure uninterrupted educational activities. The organization also equipped the schools and centres with learning materials such as whiteboards with stands, plastic mats, and water coolers. Additionally, 228 children received winterized kits.

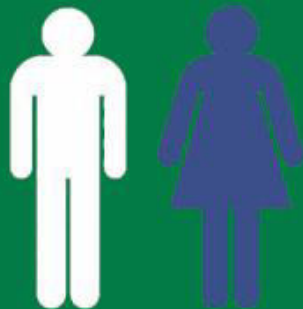
Sanjh Preet conducted 131 meetings with the school council members to raise awareness about their roles and responsibilities related to child rights, child protection, child safeguarding, new enrollment and retention, safe spaces, and children's rights.



## MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS

### Establishment of Temporary Learning Centres(TLCs)

Sanjh Preet followed a strategy of establishment of Temporary Learning Centres for ensuring continuity in children's education in government schools and non-formal centres affected during floods.

- **Distribution of teaching/learning materials**

In Temporary Learning Centres, which were established to provide education to students in areas affected by disasters or emergencies, teachers were given teaching and learning materials to support their educational activities.

Among these materials, there was a school learning pack that included several items such as a water cooler, blackboards, plastic mats, and other necessary supplies. These materials were provided to create a better learning environment for students and support the teaching efforts of the educators in these challenging circumstances.

Following depicts the number of students benefitted from this material;



- **WASH, desludging, dewatering, and fumigation of schools**

After the flood, the CEO of Education assessed the condition of schools to determine which ones required WASH facilities, rehabilitation, desludging, dewatering, and fumigation in order to resume educational activities.

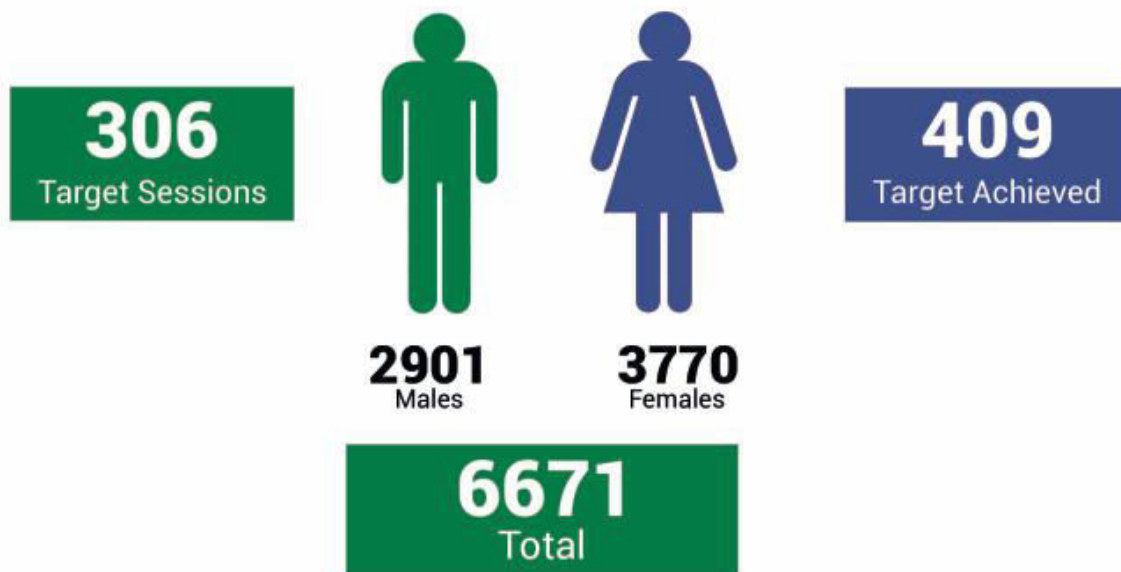
Upon identifying the necessary improvements, the SPO team met with relevant stakeholders and began the process of functionalizing the schools. This involved performing critical tasks such as dewatering, desludging, and fumigation to prepare the schools for use by students and teachers.

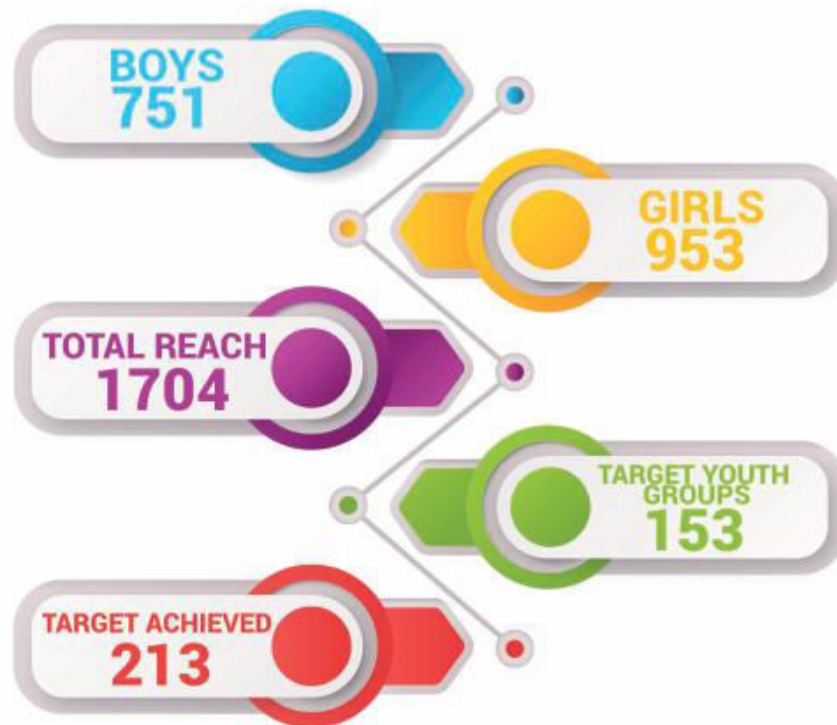
● **Winterized kits, community mobilization & dialogues with school councils**

During the reporting period, SPO procured and distributed 18130 winterised kits among school children besides holding community mobilization sessions and dialogues with school council members. The purpose of awareness and dialogues were to sensitize them on enrolment & retention of children, and benefits of quality of education. The table below shows beneficiaries of these activities;



● **Community dialogues/sessions through adolescents/volunteers/youth groups**

Under its project, SPO initiated an intervention to create youth volunteer groups in flood-affected areas to improve educational activities for children and parents. The groups were established and provided with guidance on their duties and obligations. Table shows the Sanjh Preet's youth reach out;



● **Overall beneficiaries**

Following is the detail of overall beneficiaries of the SPO's education project interventions i.e. awareness sessions, establishment of learning centres, distribution of winterization kits to support communities, distribution of school bags, school learning material and awareness raising activities on child rights, child protection and child safeguarding;



## CASE STUDY

### TRANSFORMING LIVES

Nazeer Ahmed is an eight-year-old boy living in Basti Paloo Shah in Tehsil Rojhan district of Rajanpur. Following the 2022 floods, his father, a daily wage laborer, was unable to afford his son's education, and Nazeer was forced to work in a tea shop to help support his family. This situation changed when Nazeer met Muneer Ahmad, a member of the GPS Paloo Shah youth group.

Muneer inquired about Nazeer's education and learned that he had left school after it was damaged in the floods. He then visited Nazeer's father, Bashir Ahmad, to inform him of a nearby school that had a high-performance tent installed and was providing a conducive learning environment. The teachers were also actively teaching and had received school supplies, with winterized kits set to be distributed the following week.

Impressed by what he saw and heard, Bashir Ahmad agreed to re-enrol his son in the school. The very next day, Muneer returned to Nazeer's home to ensure that he was indeed back in school. Nazeer was now able to resume his studies and become a regular student again, thanks to the efforts of Mr. Muneer and the youth group.

Additionally, Nazeer was provided with a winterized kit, and his father was grateful to Muneer for guiding him to the school and helping to secure his son's education. This case study highlights the importance of community engagement and youth involvement in facilitating access to education for vulnerable children in disaster-affected areas.



# STRENGTHENING OF LEARNING AND PROTECTION OF CHILDREN (SLPC)

## ● Introduction

Solidar Suisse is supporting Sanjh Preet Organization in implementing the Strengthening of Learning and Protection of Children (SLPC) project in the four slum areas of Islamabad including Golra, Bari Imam, Pirwadhai and Khana Pull.

With technical input of JICA, the project provides tailored education solutions and bridges learning gaps for children, especially girls, complementing the existing non-formal educational institutions besides protecting the children from abuse and violence through linkages development with the government and NGOs support services.

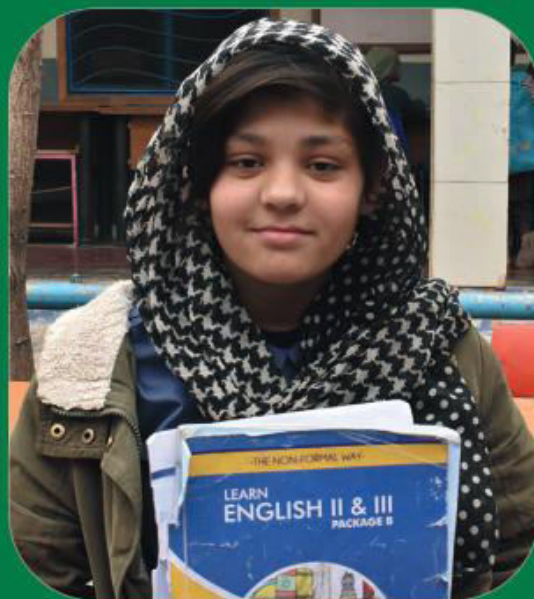

## CASE STUDY

### A STITCH IN TIME

13 years old Ayesha belongs to Kabul, Afghanistan. After coming to power in 2022, the Taliban imposed a ban on the education of girls in the country. Her family was extremely worried as Ayesha and her six sisters were confined to the four walls of the house. They wanted to get education but there was no opportunity for them to chase their dreams.



Meanwhile, her parents migrated Pakistan and settled down near Bari Imam area. Ayesha's six sisters and two brothers wanted study but were over-age, and could neither read nor write Urdu, which was the medium of instruction in the school.

Being jobless, their father could not pay monthly house rent. Ayesha and her sisters started selling flowers at shrine to make some money for a living. The children came to know about Mashal Model School which catered to out-of-school children with the support of Sanjh Preet.

Next morning, they got admission and free books, and within a short span they learnt how to speak, read and write Urdu. They are now well aware of their protection as well. Continuing as regular students of the school, Ayesha and her two sisters are getting benefit from Sanjh Preet's Accelerated Learning Program .

## ALP-MIDDLE TEACH PROJECT

The project is being implemented in collaboration with the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) with the purpose; to provide second chance of education to the girls who have left school after completing primary education due to any reason. Under the project, Allama Iqbal Open University (AIU) registered 74 girls' students with its distance learning programme, and would also certify them after conducting examination.

Learners learn through self-learning kit and they meet their teacher's minimum twice a week (face to face) to get further support, mentoring and assessment. Learning tablets have also been provided to a group of 5-6 learners as well as each teacher for learning and assessment. Under This project 74 Girls are benefitted.

## WASH- SDG-6

### RESTORATION OF EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES IN JHANG

The government Primary School of Hussain Abad, established in 1983, had three classrooms that were demolished over time, and additional classrooms were required to benefit the educational activities and the community. To address this need, the Sanjh Preet Organization (SPO) implemented a project in collaboration with Penny Appeal Pakistan and the local school council.

The project included the construction of two classrooms of and a corridor, providing a safe and healthy environment for around 215 students, shielding them from harsh weather conditions in winter and summer. The SPO also constructed three washrooms for students, promoting health and hygiene.

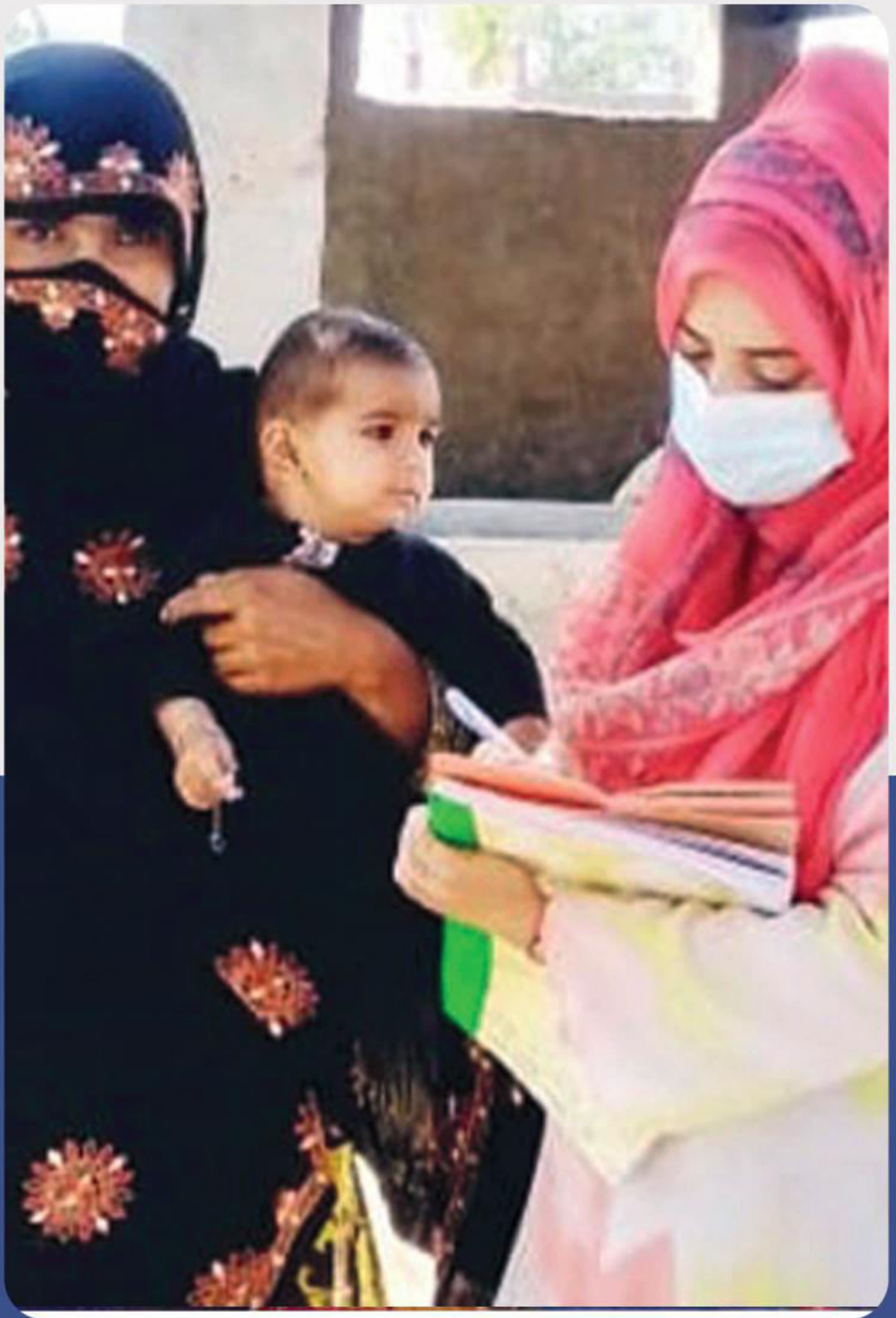
## **MOSQUE FOR THE COMMUNITY (JHANG PROJECT-EHSAAS TRUST)**

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The Sanjh Preet Organization constructed a Mosque (Masjid) in the village Chah Gal Cup of union council Allah Yar Juta, Tehsil Shorkot, District Jhang, Punjab, Pakistan, to address the lack of a permanent mosque for the community.

Previously, the community had a designated prayer room but had to go outside the village for Jumma (Friday) Prayer. The community was poor and did not have the resources to construct a mosque for performing their religious obligations, which is considered a fundamental duty by Muslims. 840 community members were direct beneficiaries of the project, which provided them with a permanent mosque to offer their prayers.





# HEALTH

Sanjh Preet Organization focuses on improving health outcomes for communities through various initiatives. One of its key efforts is to build the capacity of health workers and doctors at the grassroots level through ongoing training and awareness programs. The organization also raises awareness about the importance of health among communities through outreach and awareness campaigns.

Sanjh Preet is dedicated to supporting pregnant and lactating women and ensuring that children receive the vaccinations and immunizations they need. The organization provides ongoing education and training to local health workers and runs school health programs for children.

Through its efforts, Sanjh Preet is making a real difference in the lives of communities in Pakistan. By emphasizing capacity building, increasing consciousness, and offering care and assistance to women and children, the organization is working towards a brighter and healthier future for everyone. The last year's monsoon rains followed by floods in Punjab impacted around 830,780 people in District Dera Ghazi Khan, with pregnant and lactating women and children under the age of 5 being the most vulnerable groups affected due to disruptions in essential health services like routine immunization, antenatal check-ups, and skilled birth attendants during delivery.

To address this, Sanjh Preet implemented interventions to ensure the provision and continuity of basic essential primary healthcare services, outbreak prevention and control, and equitable and continued access to maternal, new-born, and child health (MNCH) and immunization services in the 10 most affected union councils of Dera Ghazi Khan, reaching out to 80% of the flood-affected population (including 15% under 5-year-old children and 22% pregnant and lactating women).

The interventions included the training of 285 front-line workers to engage communities on MNCH and immunization, with a special focus on zero-dose children, home-based new-born care, essential new-born care, pneumonia, diarrhoea, nutrition, and gender-based violence and protection from sexual exploitation and abuse (PSEA).

## ACHIEVEMENTS

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- ▶ **Health staff capacity building**  
333 Capacity building of health staff (45 males and 288 females) in targeted 10 flood-affected Basic Health Units to response emergency and to ensure best health practices.
- ▶ **Social mobilization & awareness sessions**  
580 awareness sessions conducted at school and communities about tackling the different health issues, check-up and personal hygiene, which were attended by 26603 Boys, 23239 Girls, 11003 males and 10954 females.
- ▶ **Doctors sessions with PLWs at BHUs**  
3048 women beneficiaries of 120 sessions with doctors at BHUs with 388 on proper handling of babies and their essential needs for first six months till 3 years.
- ▶ **Religious community leaders meetings**  
611 community leaders attended 30 meetings to play their role in the health of the communities and to address social issues.
- ▶ **Volunteers orientation on HBNC, MNCH, P&D and Immunization**  
302 Volunteers (180 males and 122 females) of three groups provided orientation for raising awareness among communities on Home-Based New-born Care (HBNC), Maternal and New-born Child Health (MNCH), and immunization.
- ▶ **Health screening sessions in schools**  
21370 students (13067 girls and 8303 boys) beneficiaries of health screening session for identifying/early detection of child with any disease, missed vaccination, malnutrition cases or any other case.
- ▶ **Pregnant women referred for ANC**  
1035 Pregnant women referred to the ANC.
- ▶ **Mothers and new-borns identified and referred for post-natal care**  
1328 Mother and new-born identified for post-natal care intervention
- ▶ **Adolescent (girls) facilitated to receive access to health services**  
732 Beneficiaries (399 girls and 333 boys) facilitated to receive the un-interrupted access to health services
- ▶ **Vaccination**  
8412 Received vaccination including 5216 girls and 3196 Boys.
- ▶ **Zero dose children identified and referred for vaccination**  
-1057 Zero doze children (657 girls and 402 boys) identified and referred for vaccination in the targeted area.  
-5000 Pregnant and lactating women and infants were provided with warm clothes and 5000 PLWs were provided with mosquito nets.

## OVERALL BENEFICIARIES

Sanjh Preet initiated a health project in a flood-affected area aimed at providing essential primary healthcare services, as well as outbreak prevention and control, to the communities in the 10 most affected union councils of Dera Ghazi Khan.

# CHILD PROTECTION

Sanjh Preet focuses on child protection and implements various initiatives to achieve its goals in this area. The organization creates child-friendly spaces during emergencies to provide a safe and supportive environment for children affected by floods, natural disasters or conflicts.

These spaces are equipped with necessary resources and services like recreational, learning, and protection services. The organization provides mobile services for communities in remote areas to ensure access to care and support.

Sanjh Preet works to identify children at risk and provide them with referrals and services. The organization also raises awareness about the importance of child protection and provides education and training to local communities to respond to and prevent child protection issues.

By continuing to work with stakeholders, Sanjh Preet is ensuring that child protection remains a priority, helping to build a brighter and safer future for children.

Following the devastating Flood in Dera Ghazi Khan and Rajanpur last year, the humanitarian situation worsened due to the existing vulnerabilities, disrupted household and community protection mechanisms, and put children at risk of various forms of abuse, neglect, exploitation, violence, and family separation.

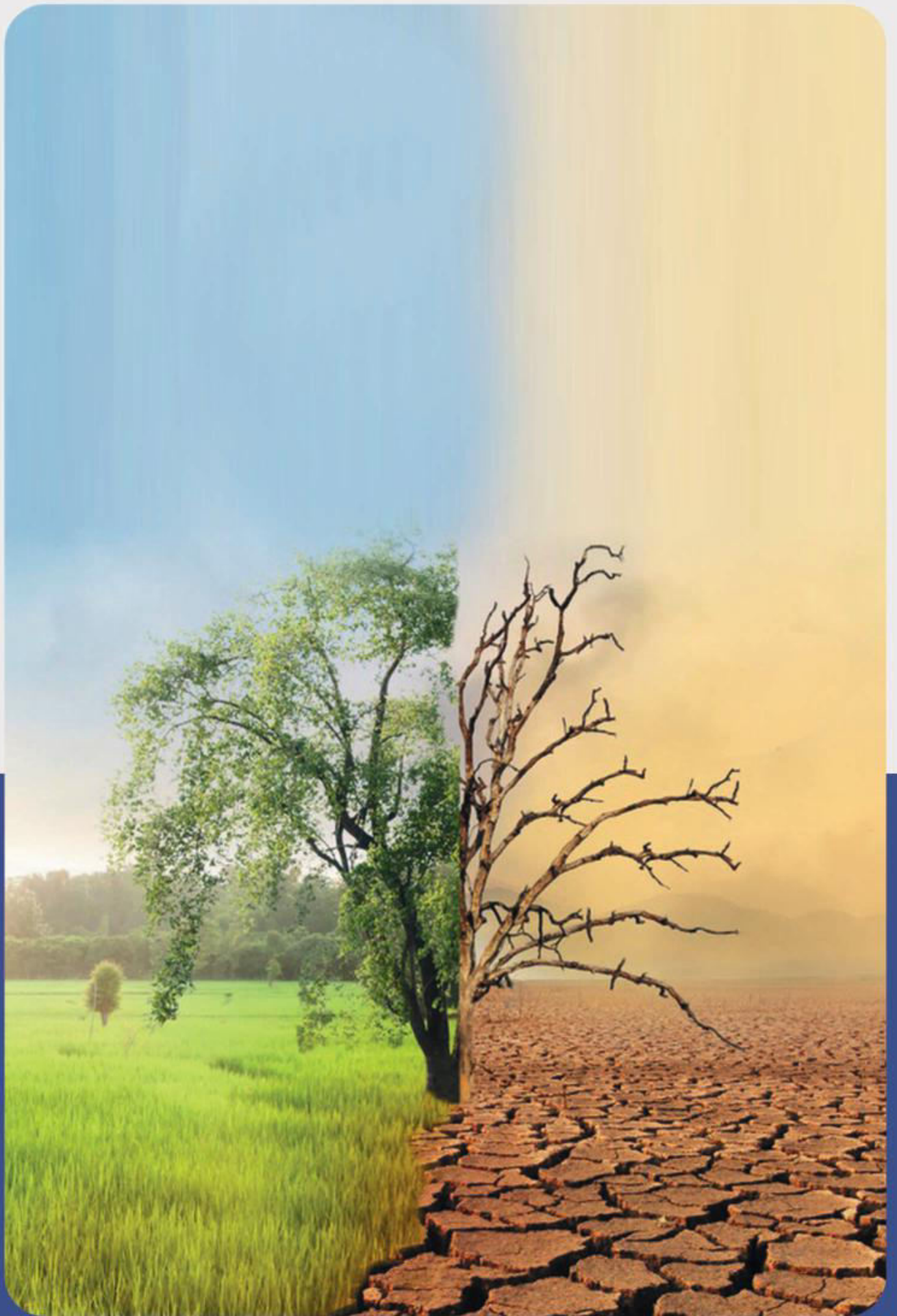

251438 beneficiaries of awareness-raising sessions on PSEA including 63873 females, 60935 males, 61684 girls and 64946 boys.

# CLIMATE CHANGE

Climate change is one of the most significant global challenges, and Pakistan is among the top ten countries that are most affected by its impact. # WASH

Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) is a critical area of focus for the Sanjh Preet Organization (SPO). The organization recognizes the importance of providing safe and sustainable access to clean water and sanitation facilities in improving the health and well-being of communities. The lack of these basic amenities can have a significant impact on the quality of life of communities, particularly those living in rural and low-income areas.

As a result, SPO is implementing a number of WASH projects to provide communities with clean water sources, as well as improve sanitation and hygiene practices. SPO recognizes that access to safe water and sanitation is a fundamental right of every human being, and the organization is committed to realizing this right for all.

To facilitate the implementation of these projects, SPO has been in contact with multinational and international organizations to secure funding. This is important as WASH projects require significant financial resources and SPO is targeting government bodies, private sector organizations, and international development agencies to secure necessary funds.

One of the key challenges faced by SPO in the implementation of these projects is the lack of infrastructure and resources in many of the areas where it operates. In response to this challenge, SPO has partnered with local communities and stakeholders to develop sustainable solutions that are tailored to the needs of each individual community. This approach not only ensures that the needs of the community are met, but also ensures the long-term sustainability of the projects.

SPO envisions a significant impact of its WASH projects. By providing clean water and sanitation facilities, the organization would be able to improve the health and well-being of individuals and communities. This, in turn, would lead to increase economic productivity and improved livelihoods of the target communities.

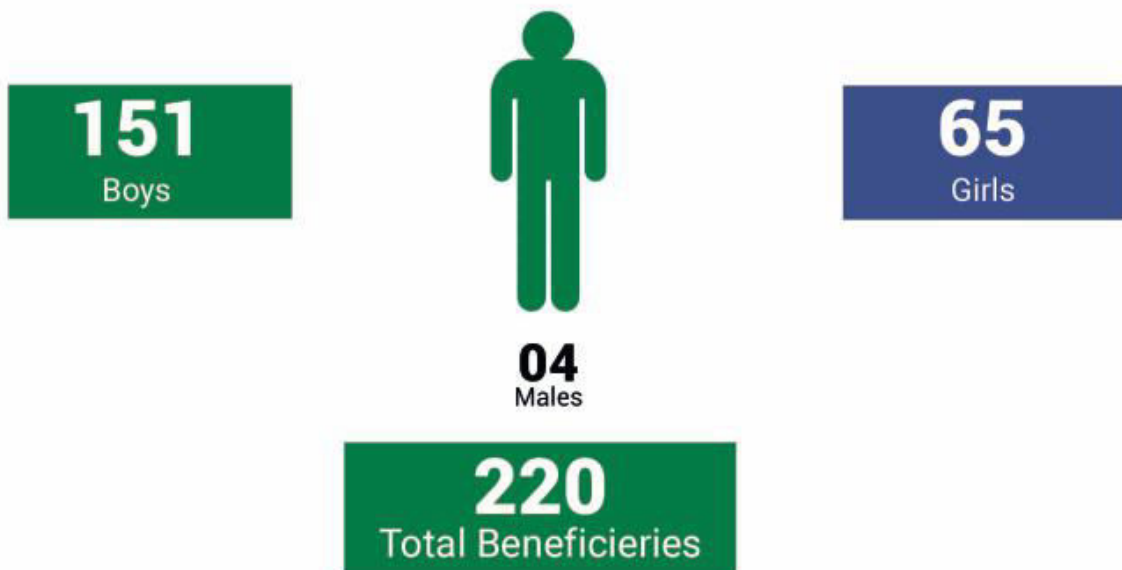
Due to the floods the underground water of district Rajanpur flood affected areas got polluted and was not drinkable, that posed the areas with serious water-borne disease and health issues. Sanjh Preet approached its trust-worthy donors to come forward and divert their WASH projects to the flood-affected areas. Both donors generously agreed and donated 350 hand pumps for the district. So far now 115 hand pumps have been installed and planned to install the rest of 200 hand pumps for provision of safe and clean drinking water among vulnerable & most needy communities.

### School Construction Project

Sanjh Preet Organization constructed a school at Shorkot, District Jhang Basti Hussainbad and provided 216 students a learning environment. SPO with the collaboration of Penny Appeal Pakistan constructed 2 class rooms along with washroom facility.



### Distribution of Food/Ration

To address the malnutrition and food scarcity, Sanjh Preet Organization distributed 900 Ration packs among poor and needy community in Districts of Nankana Sahib, Rajanpur and DG Khan with the support of Ehsaas Trust, and Muslim charity.



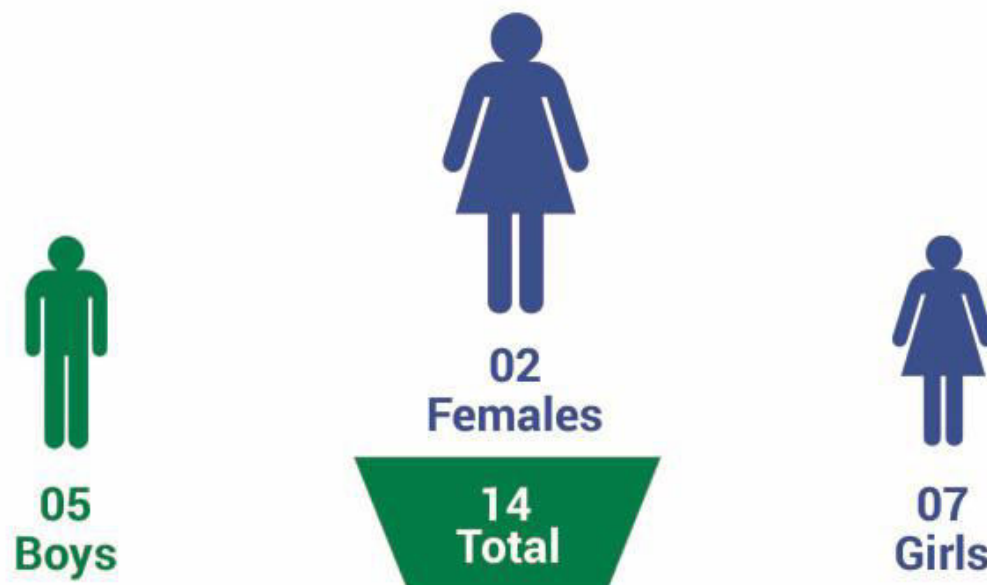
### Mosque Construction
