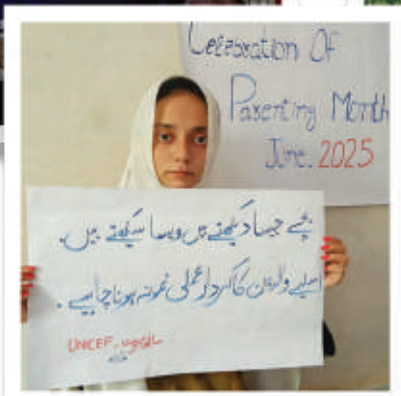

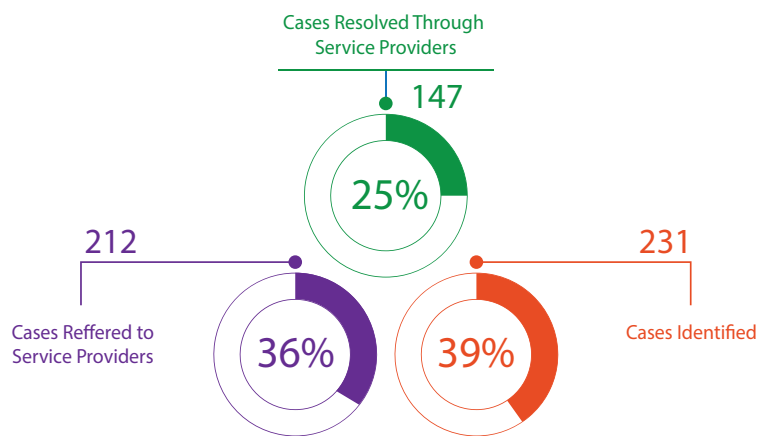

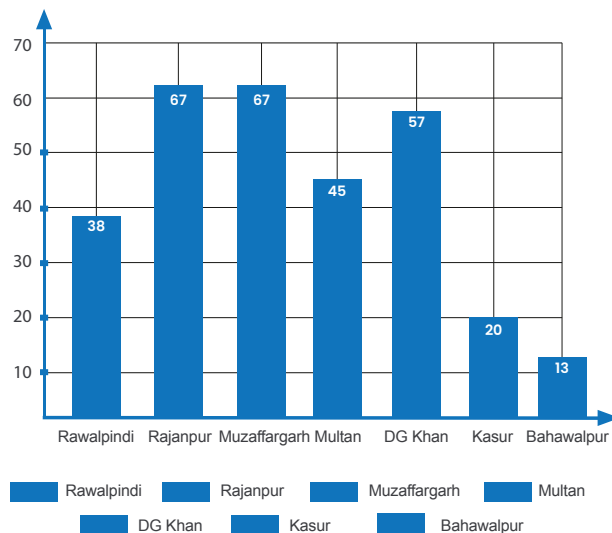

## CPC Transforming the Lives of Children

In Mehboob Wala, a quiet village in Punjab, the local Community Protection Committee (CPC) made a life-changing discovery four children with disabilities, all from extremely underprivileged families, were living in neglect. These children not only lacked proper care but didn't even have basic identity documents like birth certificates or disability registration. Their families, overwhelmed by poverty and unaware of available support, didn't know where to begin.

With kindness and patience, the CPC approached the parents, explaining how birth registration and disability certificates could open doors to government support and services. Step by step, they helped the families register the children's births and assisted them in applying for official disability certification.

But the CPC didn't stop there. Using the Referral Directory, they reached out to



Social Welfare Society Kot Addu, a local NGO. Together, they applied for mobility support, and soon, three boys and one girl received wheelchairs—a huge milestone for these children and their families.

Alongside these efforts, awareness sessions were held with the parents, encouraging them to take pride in their children and care for them with love and dignity. The families, once filled with helplessness, are now filled with hope and gratitude. As one parent shared, "This is a light in our lives—we feel seen, supported, and no longer alone."

# World Population Day



In connection with World Population Day 2025, a special awareness event was held at a local hotel by Sanjh Preet Organization, Pakistan Lions Youth Council, and Punjab Population Innovation Fund (PPIF). The event aimed to raise awareness on issues of population growth, reproductive health, and family planning. Representatives from the Education, Health, Social Welfare, and Population Welfare Departments participated in the event. The Chief Guest, Sanjh Preet CEO Parvez Akhtar, emphasized the importance of family planning in his address, stating that "population control is not just a personal choice but a collective responsibility."



District Officer Khizar Hayat represented the Population Welfare Department. Other notable speakers included Abdul Majid Wattoo from the Peace Committee Multan, Professor Dr. Tahir Mahmood from the Institute of Social and Cultural Sciences, Bahauddin Zakariya University, PPIF's Monitoring and Evaluation Manager Muhammad Imran, Lady Health Inspector Ms. Bushra, Muhammad Iqbal from the Social Welfare Department, and District Officer Literacy,



The event concluded with an awareness walk, where participants expressed solidarity on addressing population challenges and advocating for family planning solutions.





## **Enhanced Access to Drinking Water with Dignity of Marginalized Families through Installation of 10 Solar Wells in District Multan**

Sanjh preet with the assistance of Zakat Foundation aims to improve the lives of marginalized families in District Multan by installing 10 solar-powered wells, ensuring access to clean drinking water with dignity. It also promotes awareness of safe hygiene practices to help reduce the spread of preventable diseases in the community.





## Strengthening Infrastructure for Reliable Access to Academies and Teaching

Sanjh Preet with the support of Muslim charity is building new infrastructure including classrooms and upgrade existing ones in 03 government schools in district Nankana Sahib and Sheikhupura. It aims to create safe, inclusive learning environments, especially for girls, improve enrollment and retention, and strengthen community involvement in education. The initiative aligns with national goals for quality education and long-term development.



## Anticipatory Action (AA) Pilot Project under ECW

Save the Children and Sanjh Preet have launched a joint initiative under the ECW-funded First Emergency Response for Anticipatory Action in two flood-prone districts Rajanpur & Muzaffargarh. The project aims to safeguard children's right to education by preparing schools, teachers, and communities for potential riverine floods through early warning systems, school readiness plans, inclusive infrastructure improvements, and psychosocial support. With a strong focus on girls and children with disabilities, this proactive approach seeks to minimize learning disruption and promote safe, inclusive, and resilient education environments.





## Public School Reorganization Program-II

Sanjh Preet has signed an agreement with the Punjab Education Foundation (PEF) under the Punjab School Reorganization Program (PSRP), an initiative of the Government of Punjab, for the handing over of 20 schools in Tehsil Sadiqabad, District Rahim Yar Khan. As part of this collaboration, Sanjh Preet is working to rehabilitate these schools and enroll out-of-school children from surrounding communities. The initiative aims to ensure access to safe, inclusive, and quality learning environments for children in underserved areas. Sanjh Preet remains committed to the belief that every child deserves the right to education and

## Business Start-Up Project 2025

With the assistance of Muslim Charity, Sanjh preet is supportong twelve heads of households from marginalized communities in Districts Nankana Sahib, Sheikhpura, and Lahore by providing tailored, income-generating interventions based on their skills. Following a detailed field assessment, the initiative prioritizes single-parent and financially vulnerable families. Beneficiaries receive comprehensive material support to establish or upgrade small businesses such as tuck shops, fruit and vegetable carts, a tea stall, a barber shop, and other micro-enterprises, enabling them to achieve sustainable livelihoods.





## Implementation of Interventions of Early Childhood Development in UC Kotla Chakar

Sanjh Preet Organization, in collaboration with JICA, Sphere Consultant, and other partners, is working on a pilot Early Childhood Development (ECD) project in Union Council Kotla Chakar, District Multan. Responding to critical gaps in health, education, WASH, and child protection, the initiative adopts a multisectoral approach grounded in the Nurturing Care Framework. It focuses on responsive caregiving, early learning, and child safety by engaging caregivers, teachers, and community stakeholders. The project aims to ensure holistic development for children aged 0-8 through integrated, low-cost, and community-driven interventions.

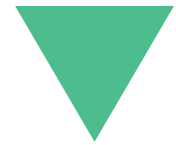
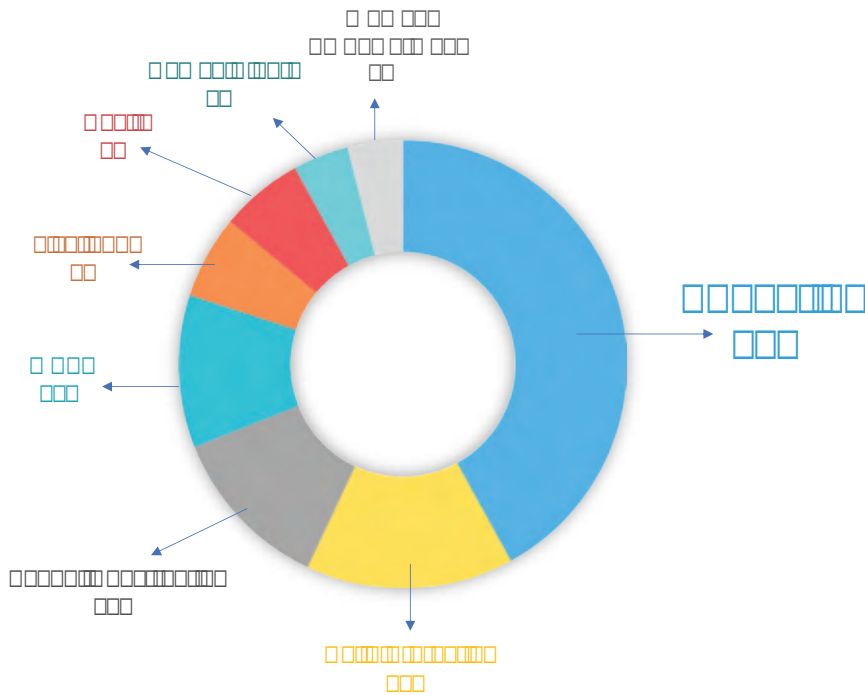
