CHILD PROTECTION IN EMERGENCIES

The Child Protection in Emergencies (CPiE) project is being implemented in the flood-affected districts of Jhang, Multan, Muzaffargarh, and Rajanpur to ensure a rapid, coordinated, and child-centered response. The project establishes child-friendly mobile and static spaces within affected communities to provide children with protected environments, where they can access psychosocial support, engage in structured learning and recreational activities, and regain a sense of routine and normalcy amidst crisis.






Five Girls, Five Futures Saved: A Beacon of Hope in Rajanpur

Basti Bajjar, a geographically isolated and historically underserved village in Tehsil Rojhan, District Rajanpur, has long faced chronic poverty, low literacy levels, weak service delivery, and deeply entrenched patriarchal norms. Girls' access to education in the area is extremely limited, and early child marriage is widely practiced as a cultural norm and an economic coping mechanism. These vulnerabilities were further intensified by the floods of 2025, which caused displacement, loss of livelihoods, and increased household insecurity. In this context, five adolescent girls were

identified as being at imminent risk of early marriage due to the absence of schooling options, strong social pressure, and heightened economic stress on their families.

In response, Sanjh Preet conducted structured community awareness sessions on child rights, child protection, and the harmful consequences of child marriage, with a particular focus on emergency contexts. The team coordinated with the Child Protection & Welfare Bureau to provide targeted counseling to parents and caregivers, which increased willingness to delay marriages. As families identified the

lack of schooling as a key barrier, Sanjh Preet advocated for the establishment of a Non-Formal Basic Education school and secured formal approval from the Literacy Department. Parents subsequently committed to not arranging early marriages, and the community demonstrated growing support for girls' education. As a result, all five girls were protected from child marriage and enrolled in school, reflecting the impact of integrated child protection and education interventions in flood-affected, underserved settings.




PSRP PHASE - II SCHOOLS- SADIQABAD

Sanjh Preet Organization is implementing the Public-School Re-Organization Program (PSRP) – Phase II in Tehsil Sadiqabad, District Rahim Yar Khan. The organization assumed management responsibility of 23 government primary schools on 15 August 2025, aiming to restore access to quality education in underserved communities.

Comparison of Enrollment September Vs. December




Overall Enrollment in the Schools



SCALE UP OF E-VOUCHER MODEL FOR BISP BENEFICIARIES IN KHANEWAL AND MULTAN DISTRICTS OF PUNJAB

Sanjh Preet, in partnership with the Pakistan Lions Youth Council (PLYC) and the Punjab Population Innovation Fund (PPIF), is implementing the Scale-up of E-Voucher Model for BISP beneficiaries. The project focused on improving maternal and child health, empowering women to make informed reproductive health decisions, strengthening healthcare providers' capacity, and increasing demand for family planning services through innovative approaches and community mobilization. Interventions included household registration of eligible women, counseling on contraceptive choices, couple counseling, continuous distribution of contraceptives, IEC material dissemination, social media campaigns, and robust monitoring and evaluation to ensure quality service delivery.

for BISP Beneficiaries**



ANTICIPATORY ACTION PROJECT

Under the First Emergency Response for Pakistan Anticipatory Action Pilot funded by Education Cannot Wait (ECW), Sanjh Preet Organization, with the support of Save the Children and UNICEF, is implementing innovative Anticipatory Action approaches in Education in Emergencies in Muzaffargarh, and Rajanpur districts. The project strengthens school preparedness through readiness and evacuation planning, capacity building of school and community structures, and awareness on education, protection, and well-being during crises. MHM-inclusive WASH retrofitting, risk mitigation measures, safe spaces, and early evacuation of school supplies are being implemented to generate evidence, influence policy, and demonstrate scalable models for future anticipatory education responses.





EDUCATION RESPONSE & RESTORATION FOR EMERGENCIES IN FLOOD-AFFECTED DISTRICTS OF PUNJAB

In response to the 2025 floods, Sanjh Preet Organization, in partnership with UNICEF, School Education Department South Punjab, and District Education Authorities, is implementing education response project across flood-affected districts of Punjab. The project is restoring learning continuity through Temporary Learning Centers, minor school repairs, WASH rehabilitation, and distribution of essential teaching and learning materials, while strengthening capacities of teachers on Education in Emergencies, MHPSS, GBV, and child protection. Climate-adaptive interventions, including solar solutions, are being introduced to enhance school resilience and ensure safe, inclusive, and uninterrupted learning for flood-affected children.



SOCIAL AND BEHAVIOR CHANGE (SBC) PROJECT

Impact and Outreach

The SBC Project engaged flood-affected communities across Multan, Muzaffargarh, and Jhang to promote positive behaviors in health, nutrition, WASH, education, and child protection. Interventions included interpersonal communication, mobile messaging, mosque announcements, focus group discussions, and community feedback mechanisms. Capacity-building training sessions were conducted for partner organization representatives to strengthen SBC programming and community accountability.



INTEGRATED SBC INTERVENTIONS IN FLOOD-AFFECTED DISTRICTS OF PUNJAB



Beyond direct sessions, our large-scale community sensitization efforts have seen a massive turnout. Utilizing 54 strategic activities, including mobile miking and mosque announcements, we reached an incredible 54,130 individuals. This broad outreach included 14,800 children and 39,330 adults, ensuring that life-saving information and social messages permeated every corner of the community. Additionally, we remain committed to professional growth, with 30 participants completing recent capacity-building exercises to further strengthen our field implementation.



FLOOD RESPONSE 2025 IN DISTRICT MULTAN & MUZAFFARGARH PUNJAB

With the support of Save the Children, Sanjh Preet Organization is implementing the Flood Response 2025 project in Multan and Muzaffargarh to address the urgent needs of flood-affected communities. The ongoing response includes free medical relief camps, establishment of Temporary Learning Centers to ensure continuity of education, creation of child-friendly safe spaces for MHPSS and recreational activities, and distribution of essential supplies to affected families, supporting early recovery and protection of vulnerable children and households.

EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT (ECD) & MULTI-SECTORAL PARENTING PROJECT



Sanjh Preet in partnership with sphere Consultants (Funded by JICA) is implementing the Piloting Multi-Sectorial Approach to Early Childhood Development (ECD) project to address critical gaps in early learning, health, protection, and community engagement in underserved areas. The project promotes responsive caregiving through parent training, expands early learning opportunities using low-cost, community-based approaches, and strengthens child protection through awareness and support systems. Through this integrated approach, the initiative aims to improve access to quality early education, reduce out-of-school children, and enhance the overall well-being of young children in marginalized communities.

LIVELIHOOD & CONSTRUCTION

STRENGTHENING INFRASTRUCTURE FOR RELIABLE ACCESS TO ACADEMIES AND TEACHING (SIRAAT)

Under the project Strengthening Infrastructure for Reliable Access to Academies and Teaching (SIRAAT), funded by Muslim Charity, Sanjh Preet Organization constructed and upgraded classrooms in three government schools across Nankana Sahib and Sheikhupura districts from July to December 2025. The project also included the installation of RO water filtration plants and solar energy systems, creating safe, inclusive, and sustainable learning environments—while supporting improved enrollment, retention, and community engagement in education.



BUSINESS STARTUP PROJECT 2025

With support from Muslim Charity, Sanjh Preet Organization implemented a livelihood support initiative to promote economic self-reliance among marginalized households. Under the project, 12 small business units were established or upgraded, including tuck shops, fruit and vegetable businesses, a tea stall, barber and mechanic shops, carts, and home-based trades, and 3 Rickshaws were also provided. These interventions enabled beneficiaries to generate sustainable income and strengthened household economic resilience, particularly for women, persons with disabilities, and extremely vulnerable families.



