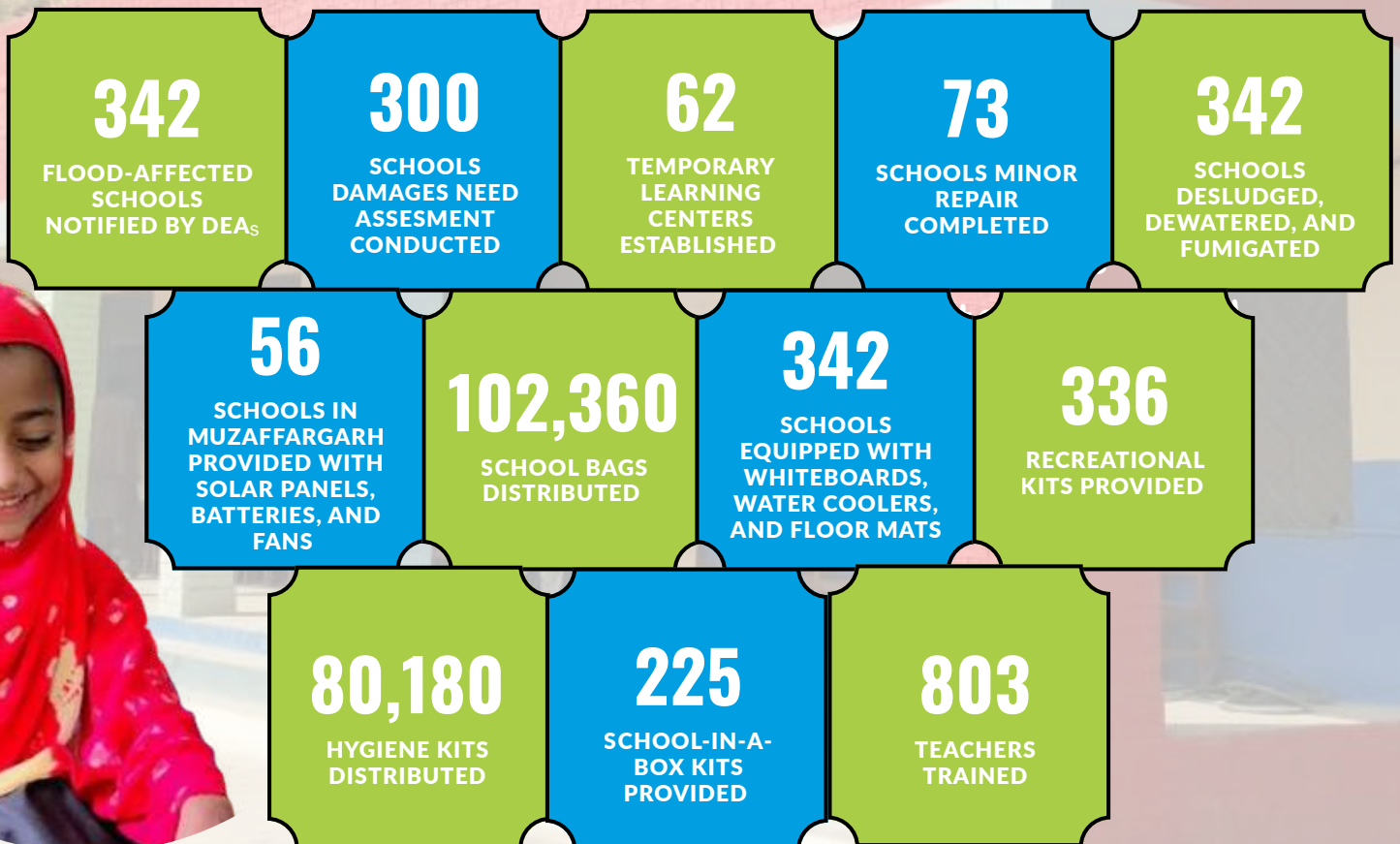

Education Response and Restoration for Emergencies in Affected Districts of Punjab



In response to the 2025 floods, Sanjh Preet Organization, in partnership with UNICEF, School Education Department South Punjab, and District Education Authorities, is implementing education response project across flood-affected districts of Punjab. The project is restoring learning continuity through Temporary Learning Centers, minor school repairs, WASH rehabilitation, and distribution of essential teaching and learning materials, while strengthening capacities of teachers on Education in Emergencies, MHPSS, GBV, and child protection. Climate-adaptive interventions, including solar solutions, are being introduced to enhance school resilience and ensure safe, inclusive, and uninterrupted learning for flood-affected children.



PREVENTION OF CHILD PROTECTION RISKS THROUGH COMMUNITY EMPOWERMENT IN THE TARGET DISTRICTS OF PUNJAB

The project has been implemented in 07 target districts of Punjab including Rawalpindi, Kasur, Multan, Bahawalpur, Muzaffargarh, DG Khan, and Rajanpur, impacted half a million people including children. The project activities are concluded in February 2026 with achieving all the targets. Many of the project interventions are sustained with the support of Social Welfare and Bait-ul-Maal Department, Govt. of the Punjab.

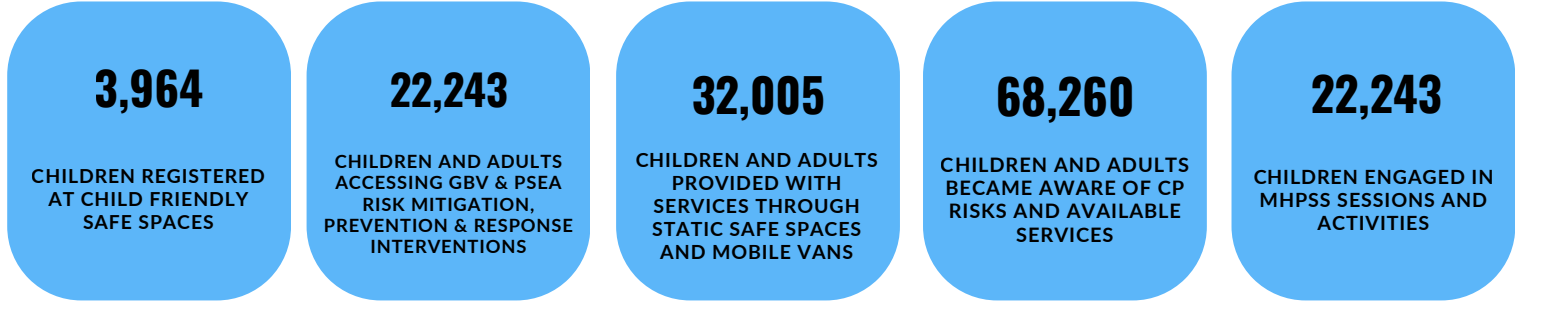

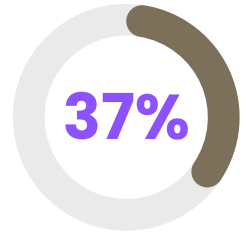
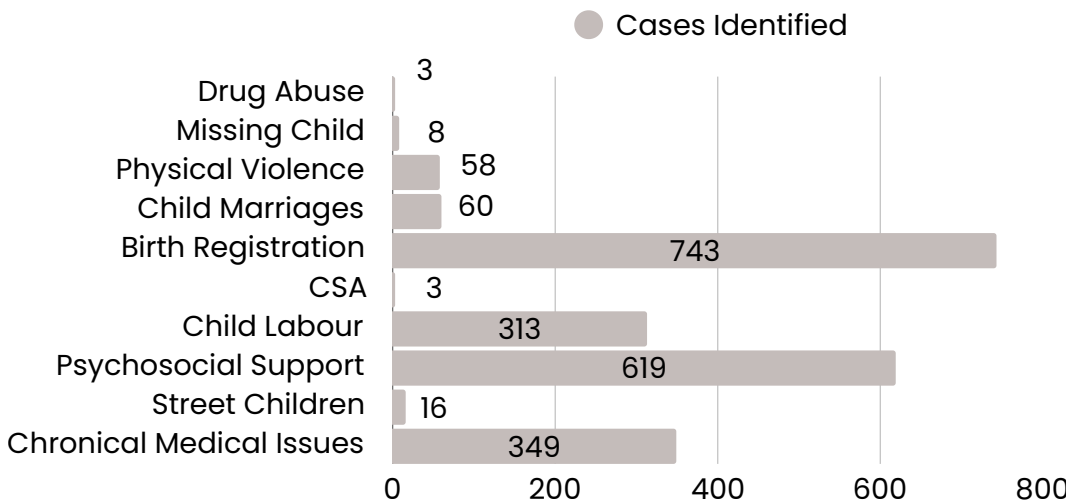


CHILD PROTECTION IN EMERGENCIES

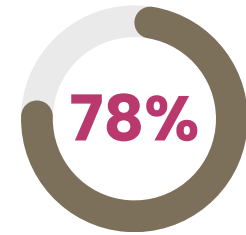
The Child Protection in Emergencies (CPiE) project is being implemented in the flood-affected districts of Jhang, Multan, and Muzaffargarh to ensure a rapid, coordinated, and child-centered response. The project established 06 mobile child-friendly spaces and 21 child friendly safe spaces within affected communities to provide children with protected environments, where they can access psychosocial support, engage in structured learning and recreational activities, and regain a sense of routine and normalcy amidst crisis.

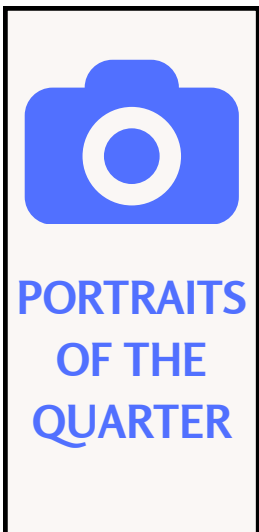

From Risk to Resilience: Preventing Child Marriage, Empowering Futures

In Basti Momna Wali, District Jhang, Sanjh Preet Organization (SPO) successfully prevented a case of child marriage involving 15-year-old Monesa Fatima during a routine outreach visit under its Child Protection Mechanism program. The SPO field team identified that, due to socio-economic pressures and prevailing cultural norms, Monesa's family was preparing for her early marriage. Recognizing the urgency, the Child Protection Team conducted an immediate visit and engaged the family through a structured counseling session. They sensitized the parents about the legal consequences, health risks, and long-term socio-economic impacts of early marriage, while also highlighting the importance of education and skill development.



Adopting a community-centered approach, SPO further involved local elders and neighbors to reinforce positive messaging and build trust with the family. The engagement remained respectful and empathetic, focusing on the child's best interests and future opportunities. As a result of consistent follow-up and dialogue, the family agreed to cancel the marriage plan and instead enrolled Monesa in a nearby vocational training institute. She is now learning stitching and embroidery skills, enabling her to work towards financial independence. This timely intervention not only safeguarded Monesa's rights but also set a positive precedent within the community, encouraging other families to delay early marriages and invest in their daughters' education.



IMPLEMENTATION OF INTERVENTIONS OF EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT IN UC KOTLA CHAKAR

Sanjh Preet in partnership with Sphere Consultants (Funded by JICA) has implemented the Piloting Multi-Sectorial Approach to Early Childhood Development (ECD) project to address critical gaps in early learning, health, protection, and community engagement in underserved areas. The project promoted responsive caregiving through parent training, expanded early learning opportunities using low-cost, community-based approaches, and strengthened child protection through awareness and support systems. Through this integrated approach, the initiative aimed to improve access to quality early education, reduced out-of-school children, and enhanced the overall well-being of young children in marginalized communities.

Strengthening Infrastructure for Reliable Access to Academies and Teaching (SIRAAT)

The SIRAAT project upgraded infrastructure in three government schools in Nankana Sahib and Sheikhpura, benefiting 1,154 students and 33 teachers. Improvements included classrooms, toilets, water systems, and solar power, creating safer, inclusive learning environments and indirectly impacting 55,500 community members while ensuring long-term sustainability through stakeholder ownership. The project was funded by Muslim Charity.



Provision of Clean Drinking Water via Solar-Powered RO Plant at GHS Bucheki

With support from Muslim Charity, a solar-powered RO plant at GHS Bucheki (District Nankana Sahib) is providing safe drinking water to 4,631 beneficiaries, including students and the local community. The initiative improved health, attendance, and learning outcomes while ensuring a sustainable, low-cost supply and benefiting over 6,000 people indirectly.



Scale-up of E-Voucher Model for BISP Beneficiaries in Khanewal and Multan Districts of Punjab

The “Scale-up of E-Voucher Model for BISP Beneficiaries in Khanewal and Multan Districts of Punjab” project, led by the Punjab Population Innovation Fund (PIIF) with support from the World Bank, is jointly implemented by Sanjh Preet and Pakistan Lions Youth Council (PLYC) in Multan and Khanewal. The project aims to improve access to family planning services for Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP) beneficiaries. Through an e-voucher system, it provides free and easy access to reproductive health services from approved healthcare providers.

First Emergency Response for Pakistan Anticipatory Action Pilot under ECW



The First Emergency Response for Pakistan Anticipatory Action (AA) Pilot under Education Cannot Wait Project in Districts Muzaffargarh and Rajanpur is being implemented by the Sanjh Preet Organization in collaboration with Save the Children, UNICEF, and the District Education Authorities of Muzaffargarh and Rajanpur. Under the project, education interventions have been categorized into three phases: readiness, prepositioning and anticipatory action to achieve the planned outcomes and outputs.



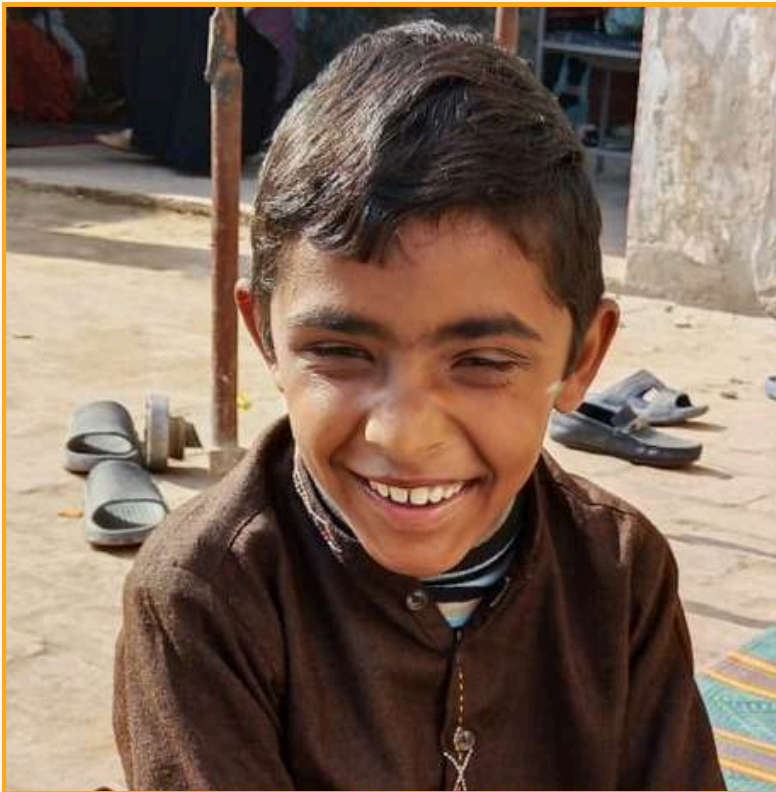
Flood Emergency Response Project in in Multan and Muzaffargarh

Sanjh Preet Organization, in collaboration with Save the Children, implemented a Flood Emergency Response Project to support flood-affected communities in Multan and Muzaffargarh. The project addressed urgent humanitarian needs through the distribution of hygiene kits, food, and household shelter items, along with the establishment of mobile medical camps providing essential healthcare services. Through these interventions, vulnerable families were able to access immediate relief and basic health support, contributing to early recovery efforts in the affected areas.

Against the Odds: Faizan's Journey Back to Learning and Independence



Faizan, a nine-year-old boy from southern Punjab, lives with his parents and younger brother. His father, Muhammad Faheem, is a Hafiz of the Holy Quran, while his mother is a homemaker. Faizan has a post-polio condition affecting his lower limbs, making it difficult for him to walk independently and attend school regularly.

The floods of 2025 further disrupted his life, damaging his home, destroying his school materials, and interrupting his education. Despite these challenges, Faizan remained determined to continue learning.



Through community awareness sessions supported by Save the Children, his family learned about available education support. Faizan first attended a Child Friendly Space (CFS), where he regained confidence and improved his emotional well-being.

He is now enrolled in a Temporary Learning Centre (TLC) supported by Save the Children and implemented by Sanjh Preet Organization, where he has received learning materials and benefits from an inclusive and supportive environment.

Although he still needs a wheelchair, uniform, and shoes, Faizan has made significant progress. He now attends classes regularly, participates actively, and interacts confidently with peers. His journey reflects resilience and highlights the importance of inclusive education and continued support for children with disabilities in emergencies.

PSRP PHASE - II SCHOOLS- SADIQABAD

Sanjh Preet Organization is implementing the Public-School Re-Organization Program (PSRP) – Phase II in Tehsil Sadiqabad, District Rahim Yar Khan. The organization assumed management responsibility of 23 government primary schools on 15 August 2025, aiming to restore access to quality education in underserved communities.

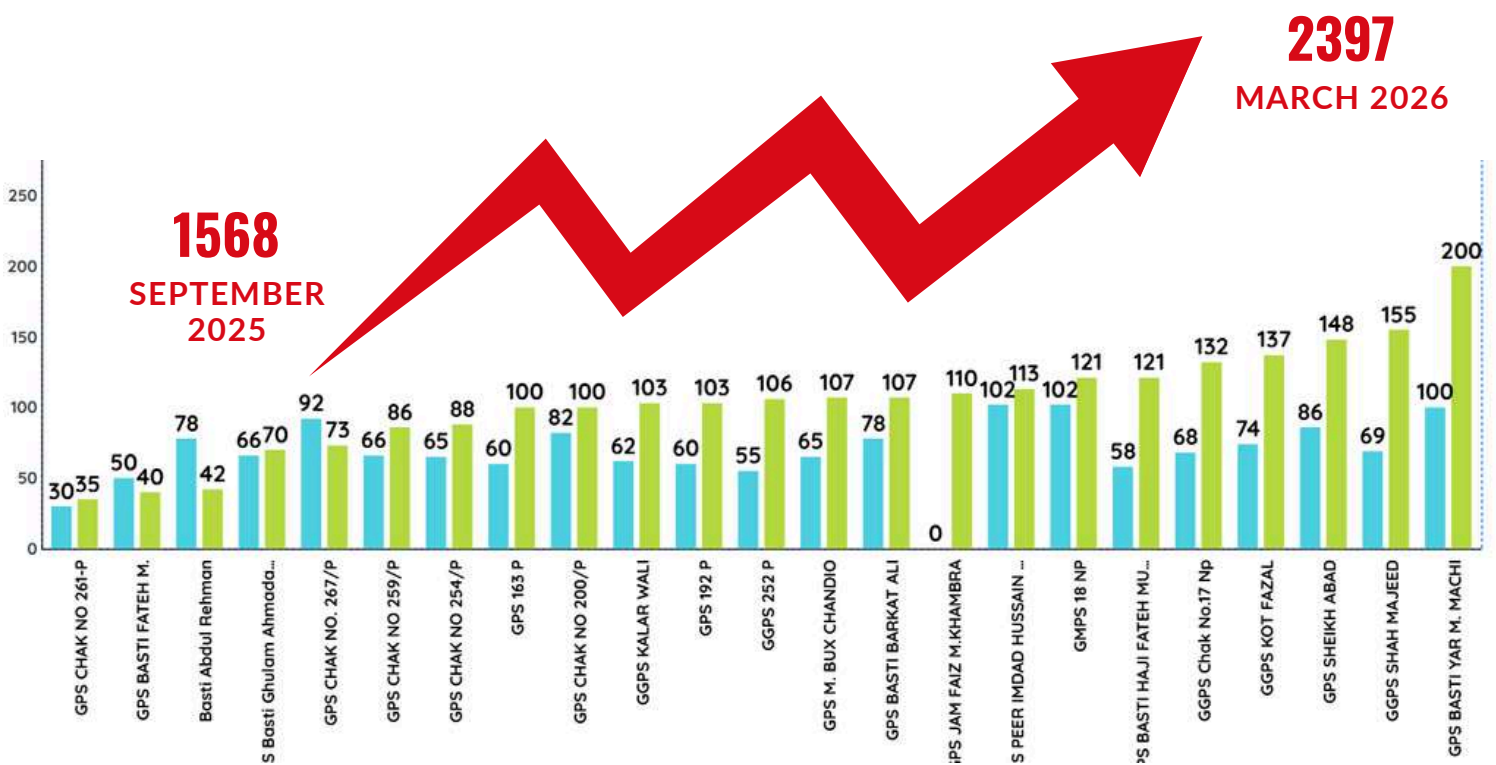

HEALTH IN EMERGENCY RESPONSE FOR FLOOD EFFECTED POPULATION IN DISTRICT JHANG, PUNJAB:

Sanjh Preet Organization implemented a Health in Emergencies response project in flood-affected communities to improve access to essential primary healthcare services. In collaboration with UNICEF and the District Health Authority, the project delivered maternal and child health services, immunization, nutrition screening, and hygiene awareness through mobile health camps. The intervention prioritized pregnant women, lactating mothers, and children under five. A total of 4,032 outpatient consultations were provided, and significantly strengthening health service access during the emergency.

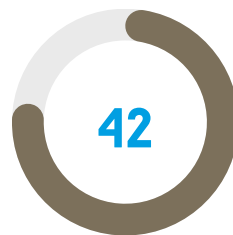


INTEGRATED SOCIAL BEHAVIOR CHANGE (SBCC) INTERVENTIONS IN FLOOD AFFECTED DISTRICTS OF PUNJAB

The SBCC project implemented in District Multan, Muzaffargarh and Jhang, aimed to promote life saving information among flood-affected communities through awareness campaigns on health, nutrition, WASH, education, and child protection. Sanjh Preet Organization implemented community engagement activities including interpersonal communication sessions, mobile messaging, mosque announcements, and community dialogues. The initiative also strengthened the capacity of staff through training on social and behavior change approaches. Overall, outreach campaigns reached approximately 1,975,312 individuals with critical information to support safe practices and community recovery.
